ASP welcomes an impressive new piece of machinery to the fleet.

The Soilmec SR30 hydraulic drilling rig has been specially designed to create cased bore piles, deep uncased bored piles and CFA (Continuous Flight Auger) piles.

The SR30 can create piles more than 40 metres deep.

ASP has put the machine straight to work in Sydney as part of the ground works preparation for Waterloo Parkview Constructions.

"The SR30 is an exciting new piece of machinery for us. It allows us to drill deeper piles than ever before and do it much faster," said general manager Patrick Buckley.
